#### TELEPHONIC Board of Directors Meeting MINUTES August 19, 2020 - 12:00 to 1:30

Call to Order (Bergen) 12:00-12:05

President Chuck Bergen called the meeting to order at approximately 12:05 pm

1. Welcome and Introduction to Annual Meeting (Bergen) 12:05 – 12:15

Welcome and thanks to Bob Bernat. Goal: Accomplish service to university community and be a collegial place where we enjoy being together and work on the club together. Time to think through how we develop new ways to engage people.

2. Ongoing Matters

Possible to do Awards dinner at different time of year - may have to go outside with this year's event.

3. Approval of 18 May 20, 2020 Board Minutes (Knoebel) 12:15-12:16

Tabled for next meeting to be approved - motion George Hodakowski, second Julie Palmer

4. Programs Committee Report (Schaumberger, Koh, Mendez) 12:16-12:30

What can we do as a club to bring people together? Line up a huge speaker. Reach out for a larger audience. Steve Schaumberger, Programs in the works Shedd Aquarium rescheduling still in process. CEO of Northern Trust targeted for November in person, may have to move to zoom, upcoming with Author crime in inner cities

Jason Koh, Nick Kristoff class of '82 NYT columnist October 1,

Catherine Katz local Harvard grad "Daughters of Yalta" program upcoming in October, cohosted by GlobalWE.

Keep eyes and ears open for speakers since we are in zoom, we can reach out more globally. Dave Yoon, virtual happy hours, 3 successful 24 attendees May, 29 in June with Stanford, 20 in July with Princeton, looking forward to planning more. Other type of events we could do quizzes, book clubs, movies, etc. Other platforms have "tables" or more flexible breakout rooms like Remo is used by Stanford, Discord for 30<sup>th</sup> Harvard reunion.

5. Financial Committee Report (Lucado) 12:30-12:50

Club is essentially in good shape. We don't have the numbers in the packet SACL working with Lucado on year end, should be done for next meeting. Lifetime revenue should not be in deferred revenue bucket and still working to balance the balance sheet. We did receive and additional 50k from Mickey Hammerman. Need to get the financials a little earlier if there are changes or questions which need to be addressed. Running events will clearly be different. Since we are doing virtual events the events themselves should not have much costs to them. These events in virtual world will be more profitable. One of the contributing factors to the club costs was the office costs which were hard to assign to specific event, but these costs will remain. For the high-profile events we will charge for them we have to take into account that there won't be catering costs when we do the pricing. June 30, cash balance \$163,000.

- 6. Membership Committee Report (Bergen, Geneva Trotter, Mike Halas, Helen Zeng) 12:40-12:45 Finished fiscal ahead of 18 by about 8%. Make it easy to join, good to be a member and harder to leave. The font on the autorenew is pretty small we should kick it up to a little larger. Sept and Oct are our biggest months historically. Helen Zeng monthly mailings for end of august, start of school year, October, smaller in November and do another outreach in December. Adding recent grads shorter simpler reach out to them. Geneva Trotter organizing files in gmail space.
- 7. Decade Committee Report (Daniliuc) 12:45-12:50

Paula to kick off a series of events called "Thought Luck" over food and discuss topics. Series of microtopics that people would be able to participate leading to deeper connections. Ideas for topics like Joy, structure a few questions, put folks in rooms then bring everybody back together for insights, etc. Looking for a leader for each particular topic to help put together the questions and sort of lead the session itself. Likely to have this on a monthly basis, include other Ivy clubs.

#### 8. Schools Committee Report (Palmer) 12:55-13:00

Julie, 64 enrollees accepted from last year, 11 in class of 2025 (deferred). Interviewing will be virtual. Forms will come next week. Virtual interviews will come in zoom, phone, facetime or other so we have to be flexible this year. Liaisons will get options to stay in contact with their schools but will be 100% virtual. Zoom or refer school to admissions office if they can't do the virtual. Phil Acevedo, we try to capture the parents at the events, we will be setting up call Sept 6 to answer questions. Did a zoom summer picnic and it was split up 2024 last week, 2025 (11) will be next week. The deferrals have affected the class size, Harvard decided to do their best to keep class sizes stable likely to make the class of 2025 have fewer slots available to accommodate the approximately 300 deferrals.

9. Community service Committee Report (Hochstadt) 13:00 to 13:05

Bruce Hochstadt, call with cook county department of correction, possibly mentoring or tutoring inmates. For the near future this would be virtual. Put together packets of learning materials for various subjects. The volunteers would be coordinated through the committee.

10. Communications Committee report (Ribaudo) 13:05 to 13:10

Rebecca, we haven't had a ton to communicate. One newsletter came out early in the Covid. Trying to put together a robust newsletter once a quarter. Add value to the community. Soliciting opinions and providing a voice for our membership. Reach out to students who are at home or who have deferred. We have email addresses to all current students, put together a flyer or post in CASH facebook to have these students involved. Perhaps offer less formal get togethers to give people a time to discuss topics in which they have an interest or an expertise. Google groups is an email discussion group way for communicating to global membership. Slack channel another communication possibility.
